A checklist has been developed using National Association of the Education of Young Children guidelines, the Grow NJ Kids program and the experience of the Preschool Advantage committee, the statement said.

Preschool Advantage is accepting applications for scholarships to its partner preschools for the school year beginning in September. Area families can apply to Preschool Advantage for funding for a half-day of preschool for 3 or 4 year-old children.
